## Follow Up After Emergency Department (ED) Visit for Mental Illness (FUM)

<p>Description</p>	<p>The percentage of ED visits for members ages 6 and older with a principal diagnosis of mental illness or intentional self-harm, who received a follow-up visit for mental illness within:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 7 days of the ED visit (8 total days)</li> <li>• 30 days of the ED visit (31 total days)</li> </ul> <p>NOTE: Each of the measures listed above is evaluated and scored separately.</p>
<p>Denominator</p>	<p>Members ages 6 and older who had an ED visit with a principal diagnosis of mental illness or intentional self-harm and any diagnosis of a mental health disorder in the measurement year.</p> <p>The denominator for this measure is based on ED visits, not on members. If a member has more than one ED visit, identify all eligible ED visits between <b>January 1</b> and <b>December 1</b> of the measurement year, and do not include more than one visit per 31-day period.*</p>
<p>Numerator</p>	<p>Members in the denominator who have had the following:**</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>7-Day Follow-Up:</b> A follow-up visit with any practitioner within 7 days after the ED visit (8 total days), including visits that occur on the date of the ED visit.</li> <li>• <b>30-Day Follow-Up:</b> A follow-up visit with any practitioner within 30 days after the ED visit (31 total days), including visits that occur on the date of the ED visit.</li> </ul>
<p>Intake and Measurement Periods</p>	<p><b>January 1 through December 31</b> of the measurement year for both the:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Intake Period (the time period when a new member can be identified for inclusion in the denominator)</li> <li>• Measurement Period (the time period wherein data is evaluated for compliance to measure)</li> </ul>
<p>Exclusions</p>	<p>ED visits that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Result in an inpatient stay</li> <li>• Are followed by admission to an acute or nonacute inpatient care setting on the date of the ED visit or within the 20 days after the ED visit (31 total days), regardless of principal diagnosis for the admission</li> </ul> <p>Enrollment in hospice during the measurement year</p>

\* If a member has more than one ED visit in a 31-day period, include only the first eligible ED visit. For example, if a member has an ED visit on January 1, include the January 1 visit and do not include ED visits that occur on or between January 2 and January 31; then, if applicable, include the next ED visit that occurs on or after February 1. Identify visits chronologically, including only one per 31-day period.

NOTE: Removal of multiple visits in a 31-day period is based on eligible visits. Assess each ED visit for exclusions before removing multiple visits in a 31-day period (see Appendix B on [page 8](#)).

\*\* Any of the following meet criteria for a follow-up visit: outpatient visit, intensive outpatient encounter or partial hospitalization, community mental health center visit, electroconvulsive therapy, telehealth visit, observation visit, telephone visit, and e-visit or virtual check-in.

## Follow Up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness (FUH)

Description	<p>The percentage of discharges for members ages 6 years and older who were hospitalized for treatment of selected mental illness or intentional self-harm diagnoses and who received a follow-up visit with a mental health provider within:*</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 7 days after discharge</li> <li>• 30 days after discharge</li> </ul> <p><b>NOTE:</b> Each of the measures listed above is evaluated and scored separately.</p>
Denominator	<p>Members ages 6 and older with an acute inpatient discharge with a principal diagnosis of mental illness or intentional self-harm on the discharge claim.</p> <p>The denominator for this measure is based on discharges, not on members. If members had more than one discharge, include all discharges on or between <b>January 1</b> and <b>December 1</b> of the measurement year.</p>
Numerator	<p>Members in the denominator who have had the following:**</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>7-Day Follow-Up:</b> A follow-up visit with a mental health provider within 7 days after discharge. Do not include visits that occur on the date of discharge.</li> <li>• <b>30-Day Follow-Up:</b> A follow-up visit with a mental health provider within 30 days after discharge. Do not include visits that occur on the date of discharge.</li> </ul>
Intake and Measurement Periods	<p><b>January 1 through December 31</b> of the measurement year for both the:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Intake Period (the time period when a new member can be identified for inclusion in the denominator)</li> <li>• Measurement Period (the time period wherein data is evaluated for compliance to measure)</li> </ul>
Exclusions	<p>Identify readmissions and direct transfers to an acute inpatient care setting during the 30-day follow-up period. Exclude both the initial discharge and the readmission/direct transfer discharge if the last discharge occurs after <b>December 1</b> of the measurement year.</p> <p>If the readmission/direct transfer to the acute inpatient care setting was for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A principal diagnosis of mental health disorder or intentional self-harm, count only the last discharge.</li> <li>• Any other principal diagnosis, exclude both the original and the readmission/direct transfer discharge.</li> </ul> <p>Discharges followed by readmission or direct transfer to a nonacute inpatient care setting within the 20-day follow-up period, regardless of principal diagnosis for the readmission.</p> <p>Enrollment in hospice during the measurement year.</p>

\* A mental health provider is an MD, DO, NP, PA, PhD or PsyD, CMHC or SUBC, RN, LCSW, LMFT, APRN, or LPN who is a certified mental health specialist. (See Appendix A on [page 7](#).)

\*\* Any of the following meet criteria for a follow-up visit: outpatient visit, intensive outpatient encounter or partial hospitalization, community mental health center visit, electroconvulsive therapy, telehealth visit, observation visit, telephone visit, e-visit or virtual check-in, transitional care management services, and psychiatric collaborative care management.

## Follow Up After Emergency Department (ED) Visit for Substance Use (FUA)

Description	<p>The percentage of emergency department (ED) visits among members ages 13 years and older with a principal diagnosis of substance use disorder (SUD) or any diagnosis of drug overdose, for which there was follow up. Two rates are reported:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The percentage of ED visits for which the member received follow up within 30 days of the ED visit (31 total days)</li> <li>2. The percentage of ED visits for which the member received follow-up within 7 days of the ED visit (8 total days)</li> </ol>
Denominator	<p>Members ages 13 and older at the time of the ED visit, with a principal diagnosis of substance use disorder (SUD), or any diagnosis of drug overdose.</p> <p>The denominator for this measure is based on ED visits, not on members. If a member has more than one ED visit, identify all eligible ED visits between <b>January 1</b> and <b>December 1</b> and do not include more than one visit per 31-day period.*</p>
Numerator	<p>Members in the denominator who have had the following:**</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>7-Day Follow-Up:</b> A follow-up visit or a pharmacotherapy dispensing event within 7 days after the ED visit (8 total days). Include visits and pharmacotherapy events that occur on the date of the ED visit.</li> <li>• <b>30-Day Follow-Up:</b> A follow-up visit or a pharmacotherapy dispensing event within 30 days after the ED visit (31 total days). Include visits and pharmacotherapy events that occur on the date of the ED visit.</li> </ul>
Intake and Measurement Periods	<p><b>January 1 through December 31</b> of the measurement year for both the:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Intake Period</b> (the time period when a new member can be identified for inclusion in the denominator)</li> <li>• <b>Measurement Period</b> (the time period wherein data is evaluated for compliance to measure)</li> </ul>
Exclusions	<p>ED visits followed by residential treatment on the date of the ED visit or within the 30 days after the ED visit.</p> <p>Members who use hospice services or benefit any time during the measurement year.</p> <p>Members who die any time during the measurement year.</p>

\* If a member has more than one ED visit in a 31-day period, include only the first eligible ED visit. For example, if a member has an ED visit on January 1, include the January 1 visit and do not include ED visits that occur on or between January 2 and January 31; then, if applicable, include the next ED visit that occurs on or after February 1. Identify visits chronologically, including only one per 31-day period.

NOTE: Removal of multiple visits in a 31-day period is based on eligible visits. Assess each ED visit for exclusions before removing multiple visits in a 31-day period (see **Appendix B** on [page 8](#)).

\*\* Any of the following meet criteria for a follow-up visit: outpatient visit with a mental health provider, intensive outpatient encounter or partial hospitalization, non-residential substance abuse treatment facility, community mental health center visit, peer support, an opioid treatment service that bills monthly or weekly, a substance use disorder service, a pharmacotherapy dispensing event, electroconvulsive therapy, telehealth visit, observation visit, telephone visit, and e-visit or virtual check-in.

Denominator	All attributing members for the measurement year
Numerator	Members in the denominator who were screened using prescribed instruments at least once during the measurement year*
Intake and Measurement Periods	<b>January 1</b> through <b>December 31</b> of the measurement year
Coding Requirements	Utilization of Z Codes for positive screening (see Appendix C on <a href="#">page 12</a> ). Payout is based on Z Codes received through claims.

## Appendix A: Mental Health Provider Definitions

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- An **MD or doctor of osteopathy (DO)** who is certified as a psychiatrist or child psychiatrist by the American Medical Specialties Board of Psychiatry and Neurology or by the American Osteopathic Board of Neurology and Psychiatry; or, if not certified, who successfully completed an accredited program of graduate medical or osteopathic education in psychiatry or child psychiatry and is licensed to practice patient care psychiatry or child psychiatry, if required by the state of practice.
- An individual who is licensed as a **psychologist** in his/her state of practice, if required by the state of practice.
- An individual who is certified in **clinical social work** by the American Board of Examiners; who is listed on the National Association of Social Worker's Clinical Register; or who has a master's degree in social work and is licensed or certified to practice as a social worker, if required by the state of practice.
- A **registered nurse (RN)** who is certified by the American Nurses Credentialing Center (a subsidiary of the American Nurses Association) as a psychiatric nurse or mental health clinical nurse specialist and is licensed to practice as a psychiatric or mental health nurse, if required by the state of practice.
- A **nurse practitioner (NP) or an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN)** who is certified by the American Nurses Credentialing Center (a subsidiary of the American Nurses Association) who has a master of science (M.S) or doctor of philosophy (Ph.D.) degree in nursing with a specialization in psychiatric/mental health and two years of supervised clinical experience and is licensed to practice as a psychiatric or mental health nurse, if required by the state of practice.
- An individual (normally with a master's or a doctoral degree in **marital and family therapy** and at least two years of supervised clinical experience) who is practicing as a marital and family therapist and is licensed or a certified counselor by the state of practice, or if licensure or certification is not required by the state of practice, who is eligible for clinical membership in the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy.
- An individual (normally with a master's or doctoral degree in **counseling** and at least two years of supervised clinical experience) who is practicing as a professional counselor and who is licensed or certified to do so by the state of practice, or if a licensure or certification is not required by the state of practice, is a National Certified Counselor with a Specialty Certification in Clinical Mental Health Counseling from the National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC).
- A **physician assistant (PA)** who is certified by the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants to practice psychiatry.
- A certified **Community Mental Health Center (CMHC)**, or the comparable term (e.g., Mental health organization, mental health agency, Mental health agency) used within the state in which it is located, or a **Certified Community Mental Health Clinic (CCBHC)**.
- **Only authorized CMHCs are considered mental health providers.** To be authorized as a CMHC, an entity must meet one of the following criteria:
  - The entity has been certified by CMS to meet the conditions of participation (CoPs) that community mental health centers (CMHCs) must meet in order to participate in the Medicare program, as defined in the Cod of Federal Regulations Title 41. CMS defines a CMNHC as an entity that meets applicable licensing or certification requirements for CMHCs in the State in which it is located and provides the set of services specified in section 1913(c)(1) of the Public Health Services Act (PHS Act).
  - The entity has been licensed, operated, authorized, or otherwise recognized as a CMHC by a state or county in which it is located.
  - Only authorized CCBHCs are considered mental health providers. To be authorized as a CCBHC, an entity must meet one of the following criteria:
    - Has been certified by a State Medicaid agency as meeting criteria established by the Secretary for participation in the Medicaid CCBHC demonstration program pursuant to Protecting Access to Medicare Act § 223(a) (42 U.S.C. § 1396a note); or as meeting criteria within the State's Medicaid Plan to be considered a CCBHC.

## Appendix B: Multiple ED Visits Calculator (FUM & FUA)

For members with multiple ED visits, subsequent visits are only applied after a 31-day period. The calendar date “in aqua” is the date of the member’s ED visit. The date “in dark blue” (listed below the member’s ED visitdate) depicts the 31-day period, indicating when to include the next ED visit. For example, if a member had an ED visit on **January 1, 2024**, include the visit that day. A subsequent ED visit must occur on or after **February 1, 2024**, to be included.
